Richard Alvin Person 07/24/24-10/18/14

Friends and family will gather in Soquel on Saturday to say faarewell to Richard Person who passed away peacefully at his home on October 18th. His beloved wife of 69 years, Ruth was at his bedside. Born in Rockford, Illinois, Mr. Person worked as a machinist. His life was interrupted at the onset of WWII, as he bravely served his country in the US Navy. His ship the USS Gambier Bay was sunk in 1944 in the battle for Leyte Gulf in the Philippines, with many of his shipmates killed. Mr. Person returned to his job following his discharge from the

Navy, and he retired as a machinist foreman with a career that spanned over 40 years.

A talented wood craftsman and master repairman, he was able to fabricate parts for things long thought beyond repair. He loved the outdoors, and many fond memories of camping and fishing trips, coupled with his uncanny sense of humor, will be cherished by his family. He also enjoyed both stream and deep sea fishing.

Richard was a member of V.F.W. Post #7263, Disabled American Veterans, and was a longtime parishioner of Mt. Calvary Lutheran Church in Soquel. He will forever be remembered as a devoted husband, father, and beloved grandfather.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth Person of Aptos, his son and daughter-in-law, Gary A. Person and Mary Person of Oroville, CA; his daughter Cathy A. Person of Capitola; sister, Patricia A. McKibben of Washington; his grandchildren, Joei Enget and Nicholas Duncan; great grandchildren: Aaron and Jordon Enget and his great great grandson, A.J. Enget. Mr Person was preceded in death by his granddaughter Vicki Neep.

The memorial celebration will be on Saturday, October 25, 2014 at Mt Calvary Lutheran Church in Soquel, beginning at 6 p.m. He will be laid to rest with military honors in a private ceremony prior to the memorial service. Allen R. "Johnny" Janz 4/25/1925-3/14/2014 S 1/c

Allen R. Janz, 89 of Fargo, ND, Passed away Saturday, March 14, 2015 at Maryhill Manor in Enderlin, ND.

Allen Robert Janz was born and raised in Enderlin, ND on April 24, 1925. He was the son of Robert and Clara (Fritz) Janz. His dad nicknamed him John, and everyone knew him as Johnny Janz.

John spent his early years in Enderlin playing Legion baseball and attended Enderlin HS playing baseball, basketball, and football. John graduated with the class of 1943, but was already serving in the US Navy enlisting in February 1943.

after enlisting, John trained as a radioman at Farragut Naval Training Station, Bayview, ID. He received his assignment to the Naval Station in Bremerton, WA and was deployed

aboard the USS Gambier Bay CVE73, an aircraft carrier that was sunk by the Japanese in the South Pacific on October 25, 1944. John was one of almost 800 men that survived in the ocean for 2 days and 2 nights until rescued by a Naval Patrol Craft. After a one month leave, he was assigned to the not-yet-built carrier USS Rendova. Awaiting completion, John played baseball at the naval base. The Rendova shipped out of Portland, OR, and transported supplies and planes from San Diego to Hawaii, and eventually supported land and air attacks off New Guinea and Guadalcanal. The USS Gambier Bay and personnel received the American Presidential Unit Citation to Taffy 3 for extraordinary heroism in the Battle of Leyte Gulf off Samar. For his service, Janz received the American Campaign Medal, the Asiatic Pacific Service Medal with three Bronze stars, the Philippine Liberation Medal with two Bronze stars and the WWII Victory Medal. In April 1946, he was honorably discharged. John also received an Armed Forces Reserve Medal for 32 years of service in the Naval Reserve, and earned the rank of Chief Petty Officer.

In 1948, Janz opened his own repair shop in Enderlin, and also began working for the Enderlin Post Office. In 1968, he became Postmaster and served in that capacity until retiring in 1980.

He was active in Babe Ruth and American Legion Baseball in the Enderlin area for many years. He was inducted into the North Dakota Amateur Baseball Hall of Fame in 1976

Johnny married his baseball coach's daughter, Dorothy Redmond on June 1, 1952. Married for 61 years, they raised two children in Enderlin. Johnny and Dorothy spent many memorable early years at hundreds of baseball games, and with their children camping at lake Ida with friends and relatives.

Johnny is remembered for the bounce in his step, his love of fishing and the lake, being a die-hard Twins baseball and Bison football fan, listening and dancing to Frank Sinatra music, and enjoying his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Johnny lost the love of his life when his wife Dorothy passed away on April 8, 2014.

John is survived by two children: Steven (Kari) Janz, Moose Lake, MN, and Joni (Jeff) Peterson, Fargo, ND; five grandchildren: Brittani Janze, Natalie (Jon) Beckstrand, Jordan (Alyssa) Sauvageau, Zachary Janz, Savanna Sauvageau (financ Q. Dillion); and seven great grandchildren Emma, Carlos, Julian, Daymian, Nicolas, Quincey, and Peyton. He is also survived by in-laws Donald (Janice) Redmond, Lloyd (Donna) Redmond, Carol Ann Pudwill, Karen Redmond, and many Janz and Redmond nieces and nephews who fondly called him Uncle John.

His grandchildren and their spouses will serve as Honorary Pallbearers.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy, parents Robert and Clara Janz, brothers Arthur and Lloyd Janz, and in-laws Jesse Lee (Pete) and Lucille Redmond and Darrell Redmond

A memorial service was held at Cormorant Lutheran Church on Saturday, March 21 at 10AM. John and Dorothy's burial is scheduled at the Enderlins Veteran's Cemetery at 2:00 PM.

Eugene Wesley Seitz 10/12/1919-3/12/2015

Capt. Eugene Wesley Seitz, USN (Ret.) of Annandale, VA died on March 12, 2015 at the Virginia Hospital Center in Alexandria, VA. Captain Seitz was a retired United States Naval Officer and decorated pilot. He was known to friends as Gene, was born in Gary, IN to George Seitz and Edina Mattox. As he grew up, he looked to the sky, building and flying model aeroplanes-a precursor of things to come. He graduated from Fresno State College and completed Civil Pilot Training courses resulting in Private, Instrument, Commercial Pilot and Flight instructor certificates. Soon after graduating he entered the United States Navy as a Naval Aviation Cadet in June of 1941, graduating from the

Pensacola Naval Air Station on December 31, 1941 with his commission as a new Ensign and coveted gold Naval Aviator wings.

Gene served in WWII, Korean War, and the Viet Nam War. In WWII, he served aboard a number of aircraft carriers as a fighter pilot, he was awarded two Distinguished Flying Crosses with Oak Leaf Clusters, and three Single Mission Air Medals with Oak Leaf Clusters. The ship on which he was serving, the USS Gambier Bay, received a Presidential Unit Citation after being instrumental in launching all of her aircraft safely, though she was later sunk by a Japanese Surface Action Group during the Battle of Samar on October 1944. Later reassigned to another squadron, Gene served in Fighter Bomber Squadron 14, VBF-14 aboard the USS Intrepid. He took part in the occupation of Japan following the surrender.

After WWII, Gene remained in the Navy. In the Korean War, he served as Commanding Officer of VBF-14 and Fighter Squadron 82 (VF-82) aboard various aircraft carriers including the USS Coral Sea, and USS Midway. During the Viet Nam War, he served aboard the USS Franklin Roosevelt and USS Oriskany.

Captain Seitz attended the Naval General Line School and graduated from the Naval War College, after which he was assigned to and served in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, Bureau of Aeronautics, and Bureau of Ships, subsequently serving as Aviation Plans Officer for the US Naval Forces Far East, Japan. Following a tour as Chief Staff Officer at the Naval Research Laboratory in Bethesda, MD, Captain Seitz retired in June of 1966.

Over his lifetime, Captain Seitz earned a Bachelor's degree from George Washington University, and a Master's degree in the Geography of China from the University of Maryland.

A lifelong pilot, Captain Seitz recently renewed his interest in flying, and soloed again on his 82nd birthday! He finally hung up his helmet in 2005, after recording 6,000 flying hours.

Gene was a member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, the Experimental Aircraft Association, and the US Naval Institute. He wrote a book about his career in Naval Aviation, *Born To Fly*, and was honored by the US Navy and Commander Carrier Strike Group Eight while aboard the USS George Washington (CVN-73) in 2008. He was also inducted by the Commemorative Air Force into the American Combat Airmen Hall of Fame.

Gene was twice married, first to Dorothy Ruth Seitz in 1942, who passed away in 1980, and subsequently to Jean Stewart Seitz in 1982. Also preceding him in death were his sisters, Helen Brown and Dorothy Osborn, brother Lt/Col Edwin Seitz and daughter, Shelby Wolf.

He is survived by his wife, Jean Seitz; daughters from his first marriage Martha Bitar of Alexandria, VA, Karen Hocking of Marshfield, WI; his step son LtCol Robert Ryan Wilkins, USMCR(R) of Wilmington, DE and step daughter Jane Finney of Lake Havasu City, AZ; and two close grandsons, Sean Wilkins of New York, NY, and Kevin Wilkins of Washington, DC, along with ten grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Captain Eugene Wesley Seitz will be interred in the Arlington National Cemetery with full military honors.

(Rest in Peace Gene, you lived a full life.

Anthem Veterans Memorial

This memorial is located in ACC Community Park in Anthem, AZ.

It is a monument dedicated to honor the service and sacrifice of our country's armed forces.

The five pillars represent the unity of the five branches of the United States Military serving steadfast together.

They are staggered in size with their appropriate military seal placements on each pillar based upon the Department of Defense prescribd precedence.

At precisely 11:11 a.m. each Veterans Day (Nov. 11), the sun's rays pass through the ellipses of the five Armed Services pillars to form a perfect solar spotlight over a mosaic of The Great Seal of the United States.



Additionally, the brick pavers with the Circle of Honor are inscribed with the names of U.S. servicemen and women, symbolizing the support for the Armed Forces. The pavers are red, the pillars are white, and the sky is blue to represent America's flag. The circle represents an unbreakable border.


