I look forward to seeing you at the 2019 reunion in San Diego.



The founder of **TOPGUN** tells his story

Dear Reader:

I don't send mass emails very often because I don't usually enjoy receiving them myself. (I'm also doing a little writing—please see the PS below.) But I hope you'll bear with me while I tell you a quick story and recommend a new book that I'm particularly proud of having been involved with.

Quite a few years ago, a gentleman from San Diego emailed me to say he enjoyed my book on the Guadalcanal naval campaign, *Neptune's Inferno*. He mentioned that he had flown jets during Vietnam and had been part of a west coast Navy fighter squadron, VF-121, that had something to do with the TOPGUN program.

I thanked him for writing and for his service. Because I was hip deep working on *The Fleet at Flood Tide*, that was the end of it for a while. I filed away his email, thinking I might want to connect with this individual again some day.

It turned out to be a long time—six years—before I finally spoke to Darrell Gary. When I did, I learned that America's finest are pretty good at burying a lead. It turned out Darrell was one of the founding instructors at the Navy Fighter Weapons School at Miramar back in 1969.

Darrell soon introduced me to some other members of the TOPGUN "tribe," including the retired Navy captain who was once his boss at Miramar.

That man is a remarkable 84-year-old named **Dan Pedersen**. Though his call sign back in the day was "Yank," more people know him as "The Godfather of TOPGUN." He created the famous fighter tactics schoolhouse and served as its first officer-in-charge.

I think he's someone whose story all Americans should know.

It's been my privilege to help Dan publish an exceptionally fine memoir. **TOPGUN: AN AMERICAN STORY** will be released on Tuesday March 5th by Hachette Books.

It's the first time one of TOPGUN's "Original Bros" has published a book, and I consider it one of the finest combat aviation memoirs ever published. Dan takes you from the dawn of jet fighter aviation in 1953, when he joined the Navy as an enlisted man, to the current travails of the F-35. In between he tells the story of how a small group of junior officers—from Miramar to Area 51—overturned the status quo and changed the air war over North Vietnam by training our best Navy fighter pilots to fly the F-4 Phantom as it had never been flown before.

The book is personal, authoritative, thrilling, and action packed. It has a pretty good love story in it too.

I hope you'll consider getting a copy, reading it, and telling your friends.


History is alive only to the extent people know it. Here is a piece of history worth knowing, the story of TOPGUN as only its founder can tell it.



City tour of San Diego -Sat October 26th 9:00AM

The tour will visit the Taffy 3 Memorial and the Bob Hope Memorial, downtown, with time to explore and take pictures. Then proceed over the Coronado Bridge and stop at the Coronado Beach with nearby restrooms. The narrated tour would pass by the famous Del Coronado Hotel, then a tour of Balboa Park.

The tour would pass through the historic Gaslamp district and drop off those who would like to go Seaport Village to have lunch on their own and shop in many one of a kind shops.

Those on this tour that would like to return to the hotel without the Seaport Village stop, will be brought back to the hotel, after the others are dropped at Seaport Village.

This tour will return back to the hotel between 1:30 - 2:00 P.M.

Santee Park -Sat October 26th - If you have your own vehicle and want to witness the model builders remotely maneuvering the 13 ships they built on Santee Lake, we will have directions to Santee Park in the hospitality room. It will take approximately 40-45 minutes to get there, make

In the Point Loma room(bottom floor of the tower) will be a display of all 13 ships in Taffy 3. They were built By a group of experienced, volunteer, and professional model ship builders in 1:96 scale and they are remote controlled. They will be displayed all day Friday as well.

Friday - Oct. 25th - Memorial Service at Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery- Board buses at the hotel at 8:45 A.M. (Boarding will begin immediately with the first two rows on each bus designated for Handicap.)

Departure of all buses will commence at 9:15 A.M., with all buses departing and traveling in succession. The buses will arrive at 9:45- we will work at short distance to the chairs for the service to start at 10:00 A. M.

After the Memorial Service, we will have an opportunity to walk across the street to view and photograph some of the Taffy 3 monuments and then re-board the buses and proceed a short distance to visit the other area of Taffy 3 Monuments.

We will re-board the buses and arrive back at the hotel at 12 P.M.
